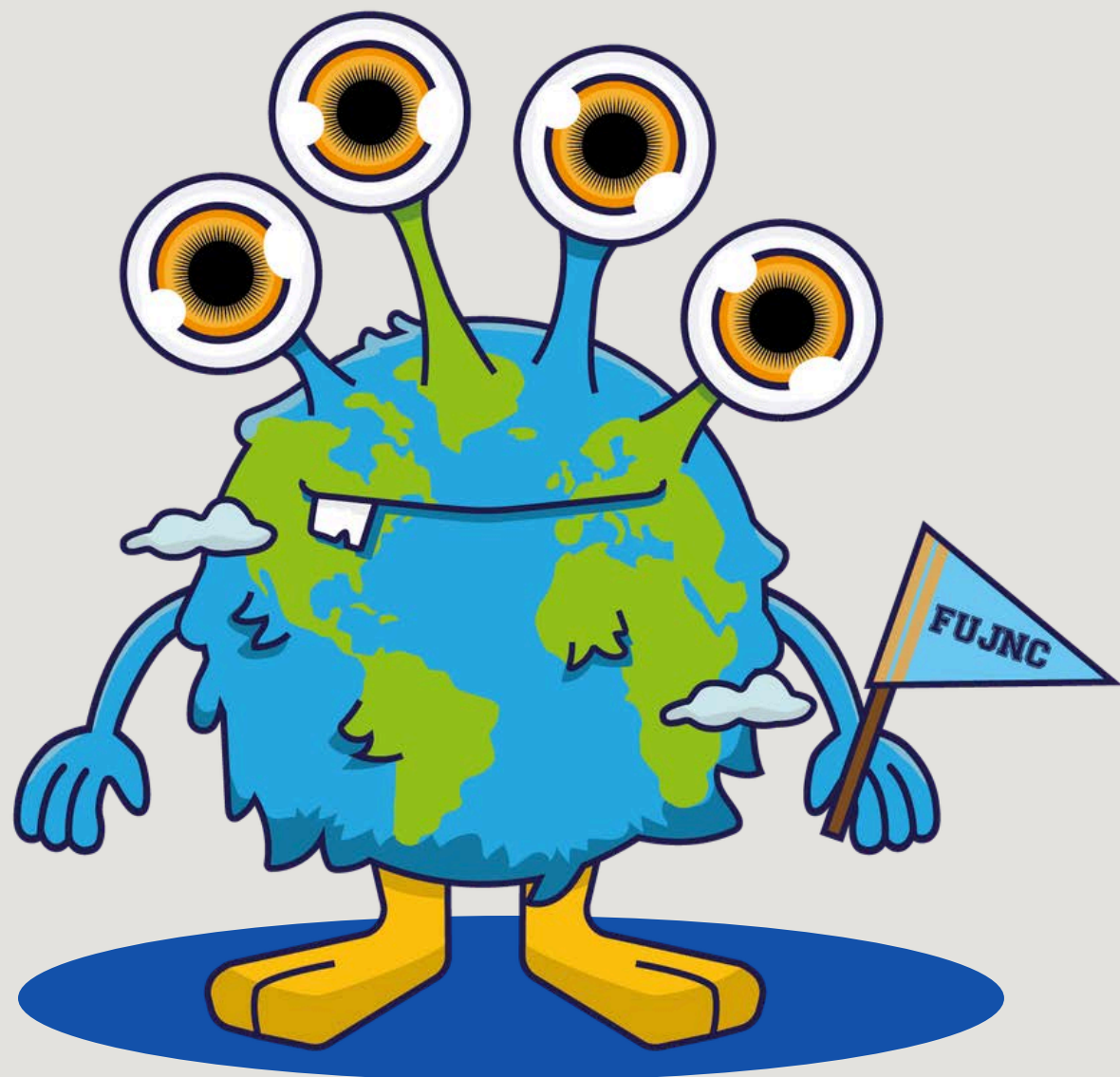

Homestay

The Department of Global Initiatives offers the Anfitriones Corpistas Program as a support strategy and alternative for international students participating in mobility and/or exchange programs in Bogotá, D.C. The main objective of this program is to promote multiculturalism.

Cost and Payment Method: The weekly accommodation fee varies according to the income level of the student's country of origin: USD 95 (2026 fee) per week for students from high-income countries.

Program Benefits

- Private room and shared bathroom (with a maximum of one person).
- Access to all common areas and basic household services, including internet connection.
- Possibility of choosing a location near Corpas, subject to availability

Places to stay

Airbnbs located near Plaza Imperial, Colina, or Mazurén. Please keep this in mind:

- Review the contract terms carefully. Verify whether the price includes services such as water, gas, electricity, and Wi-Fi.
- Make sure the space has everything needed for a comfortable and functional stay, such as basic furniture, well-maintained facilities, and secure access.

Before traveling to Colombia

All international guests, students, teachers or staff must send the following information to global@juanncorpas.edu.co:

- A copy of their international health insurance.
- Arrival date, airline, flight number.
- Accommodation address in Bogotá.

Documents and requirements for entry into Colombia



- Letters issued by Corpas - entry to Colombia
- Health insurance
- Lodging information
- **Fill out the Colombia migration form - check-mig (48 hours before your flight)**
- Optional: Yellow fever vaccine, if traveling outside Bogotá (Llanos Orientales, Amazonía, Orinoquía, Magdalena Medio, Norte de Santander)

Arrival at the international airport El Dorado



1. Landing
2. Check that all my belongings are with me before getting off the plane
3. Go to immigration and check that **the PID (Permiso de Integración de Desarrollo) code stamp** is stamped in my passport.
4. Connect to the airport Wi-Fi and announce my arrival
5. Collect my luggage

Migration info

For stays longer than 6 months, it is mandatory to obtain a visa at the Colombian consulate in your country of origin and send a scanned copy to global@juanncorpas.edu.co before you arrive in Colombia. Without this process being completed, you will not be allowed to begin activities at the institution.

For stays shorter than 6 months, you must present your invitation letters to the immigration officer at the airport to be granted the **PID (Integration and Development Permit)** for your first 90 days of stay. If necessary, this permit may be extended for an additional 90 days.

If you are granted a tourist permit (PT, Permiso de Turismo) instead, you will be required to request a status change at the Migration Services Facilitation Center and assume the associated costs of this procedure, since a tourist permit does not authorize participation in activities at our higher education institution.

Departure from El Dorado International Airport



1. Take a cab from the airport shuttle service
2. Departures 1 to 5 - in front of the international departures gate
3. Queue and wait for the cab to be assigned to you
4. Average price: 50,000 COP / 15 USD

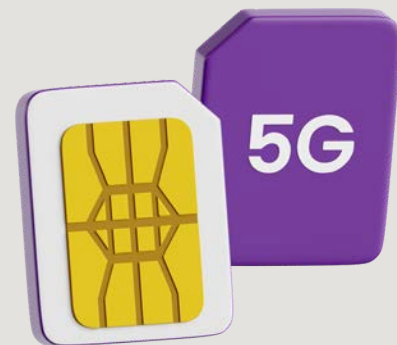
Tips

- Remember: cultural interactions are not free of conflict; success depends on how we manage and resolve those conflicts.
- Do not use your cellphone on the street.
- Avoid riding very crowded buses.
- Avoid withdrawing money from ATMs on the street; it's safer to do so inside shopping malls or banks.
- Always keep personal belongings inside bags/backpacks or inside your coat – not on your back.
- If you are going to take a taxi or Uber, make sure to request the ride through the official apps.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash, and ideally avoid carrying credit/debit cards – and definitely do not carry your passport. Do not store your cards in your phone case.
- Be cautious in bars; it's safer to stay with your group.

Tips

- Keep a digital copy of your identification page and entry stamp.
- Emergencies: 123 or 911. By dialing either of these numbers from your phone, you can report any emergency situation, whether related to safety or health. Try to always be aware of your location so you can report it more easily.
- In case of any health-related issue, immediately contact your travel insurance provider. Keep their contact information handy at all times, along with your policy or voucher number. Also inform the FUJNC Mobility team

Sim Cards



First of all, the best option is to bring an unlocked phone and buy a SIM card from a local operator once you arrive, some companies allow you to get postpaid plans using your passport, usually starting at around COP \$40,000 per month, which are quite complete, however, prepaid plans also offer good options.

Main companies: Claro, Movistar y Tigo

Money

The official currency is the Colombian peso (COP), which is the only currency accepted in stores and businesses.

Coins in circulation: 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1,000 pesos.

Bills available: 2,000, 5,000, 10,000, 20,000, 50,000, and 100,000 pesos.

Where can I exchange foreign currency? The first option is always the airport, and it's fine to make sure you have some Colombian pesos for your first two or three days (we suggest having around \$200,000 for this time). However, the exchange rate there is usually not very favorable.

The other option is in front of Unicentro Shopping Center: Across from Unicentro, there is a "plaza" with many exchange offices. The approximate address is Carrera 15 with Calle 122, to get there, you can simply tell your driver to take you to Unicentro and drop you off on Carrera 15.
